

Enriching Students of Poverty

Description: This workshop is designed to provide Pk-12th grade teachers an opportunity to work collaboratively to support classroom learning and engagement for students who are impacted by poverty. In this workshop, participants will learn what research reveals about the connection between poverty, student behavior, and academic performance. Participant discussion will focus on instructional strategies that can be used to increase academic achievement and attendance while addressing the unique needs of students living in poverty. Teachers will participate in an intensive two part book study Poor Students, Rich Teaching-Mindsets for Change by Eric Jensen. Through this book study, K-12 teachers will:

- Understand the urgency in regard to addressing U.S. poverty
- Gain four fresh mindsets to effect change
- Build important relationships with students
- Help all students see achievement as a reachable target
- Create a welcoming, high-performing classroom where all students love to learn
- Engage all students for success
