# The Empire State Information Fluency Continuum

Students are the heart of any school library program. As school librarians, we teach our students the skills needed to succeed in the ever-changing and complex information environment. The Empire State Information Fluency Continuum (ESIFC) has been re-imagined to provide a guide for that teaching; it is a comprehensive PK-12 continuum of the skills, responsibilities, and dispositions that will enable our students to flourish, both personally and academically. The skills of the ESIFC will align with the expectations of various national and New York State standards documents.

During this session, we will explore the new ESIFC and translate it into action. We will focus specifically on new concepts from the ESIFC including design thinking and student agency. Time will be provided for you to work collaboratively with colleagues to map out a year-long approach to teaching the updated priority skills. By the end of this session you will have started drafting a lesson plan aligned to the anchor standards of the re-imagined ESIFC.
